We serve a membership of 680 clubs and leagues and almost 40,000 individual members.


### OUR VISION



## WHAT OUR REGIONS DO


Our ten regions support and are supported by the central function of Basketball England. Within their region, the committee and volunteers enable and lead on the following areas:


- Support local clubs, leagues & associations



### WHY ARE PRICES INCREASING?

- Rising cost of administering the game as it grows
- Added investment in services such as Safeguarding and Club/Regional support
- Growth in participants and teams in National League competitions, resulting in delivery of the biggest NBL ever by team and participant numbers (2023/24)
- Inflation and rising infrastructure costs

#### Considerations in increasing prices

- Cost to participants of our licence is only 3% of annual spend on basketball\*
- NGBs in most other sports are on average more to register with
- Our central funding from Sport England is tapering next year
- We will be providing financial support to the BBF, the accredited FIBA body



### WHY ARE PRICES INCREASING?

Our minimal increases over the past 10+ years will make our increases appear disproportionate.

#### What is the costs

- Average membership price increase of £12
- Average U18 local league player price equates to 38p per week
- Average adult local league price equates to 77p per week

Signpost and support clubs to access funding, The Sport England Movement Fund has recently launched, designed to tackle inequalities in sport, clubs can now apply for grants of up to £15,000.

Marketing and Club Development resources have been developed to support your club.

#### SLAM JAM

A 6-week fun participation programme for boys & girls aged 7-11, providing their first introduction to basketball.

New player pathway recently launched.

#### JNR NBA (SCHOOL COMPETITION)

The biggest of its kind in the world hosting 720 teams who participate in regional competitions.

## OFFICIATING


- Regional REDD projects in the North-West, South-East, London, Yorkshire, Suffolk and the North-East to enhance the support officials
- Level 1 & 2 referee , table officials and the Introduction to Statistics courses revamped and launched
- Course to court improve conversion from learners to active officials

## COACHING

Launch Coaching Plan for more and better coaches:

- Address increase in the numbers of coaches and driving up standards
- Improve the cohesiveness of its coaching communities
- Improvement of course deliveries
- New mentoring programme
- Additional CPD in addition to core qualification courses
- National and regional clinics





## SAFEGUARDING & EQUALITY, DIVERSITY AND INCLUSION

- Continue to work the <u>Child Protection in Sport Unit (CPSU)</u>, <u>NSPCC</u> and the <u>Ann Craft Trust</u> to develop and maintain robust policies and procedures to safeguard children and adults at risk
- Launch in-house basketball-specific Safeguarding course
- Publish Diversity and Inclusion Action Plan to build on work that saw BE named Sporting Equals Sports Organisation of the Year 2023

## REGIONAL AND LOCAL LEAGUE SUPPORT

#### Continue to:

- Support local clubs, leagues & associations
- Coaching and Officiating development
- Administration & governance support

#### As well as:

- Through new membership model
  - Invest further in regional developments, led by each regional chair and commitee
  - New supporter membership will generate additional revenue opportunity for clubs
- Improved digital and service for clubs and leagues
- Explore new commercial opportunities for clubs
- Further support funding bids
